

Your Provider Registration Application Form

Medicare Urgent Care Clinics

The form/s used to register for a Medicare Urgent Care Clinic (Medicare UCC) Medicare provider number (MPN) are the same as existing forms (HW019 and HW088). There are only a few additional questions you have to consider when applying for a Medicare UCC specific MPN.

1 Ensure the address associated with your Medicare Provider Number for this practice matches the physical address of the practice in the Organisation Site Record.

2 Indicate on the form that you will be working at a 'government funded Medicare Urgent Care Clinic' by ticking 'Yes'.

3 Insert the Organisation site ID for this clinic as provided by the Medicare UCC practice manager.
